UNESCO Associated Schools:

A number of Qatari schools joined the global network of schools Associated with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in response to the principle "Think Globally and work Locally."
The State of Qatar joined the network in 1983 with one school: Doha Secondary School for Boys. Since 1989 and until 2022, the number of joining schools has increased to 99 schools for boys and girls in the three educational stages.

The National commissions' Publications:

•In the context of its role in raising awareness, insight and enriching educational thinking, Qatar National Commission has been issuing a periodical journal, since 1972, titled "Education". It is a guarterly adjudicated journal. It explains and analyses some of the important scientific, educational, cultural and social issues, through publishing the views and thoughts of Qatari and Arab prominent authors, scholars, officials and subject-area specialists, including university professors, researchers and experts. Furthermore, the journal publishes the National Commission's local, regional, Arab and international news and events. The number of publications issued in both Arabic and English until December 2021 reached 202 magazines which are exchanged or given as courtesy gifts to most government agencies and ministries within the country as well as to universities and educational research centers across the Arab states.•The State of Qatar joined the network in 1983 with one school: Doha Secondary School for Boys.
